- Obtain library user testimonials.
- Develop strong partnerships with other libraries. Take advantage of networks.
- Be a mentor. Help a new colleague.



Promote government documents to retain your job and program

- Identify different ways Government information resources are used in the library.
 - 75% of reference questions are answered wholly or in part using Government information at Benton Harbor Public Library. 2006 FDLP Library of the Year.
