
Office of the Vice President for Research (OVPR)

Grants & Sponsored Awards at University of Minnesota

- One of few universities with Agriculture, Medicine and Technology emphasis
- Receive 98% of all federally sponsored research grants awarded to higher education institutions in Minnesota
- Nearly \$620 million dollars in sponsored research awards



History of Collaboration

- 1990's workshops offered by the Bio-Medical Library focusing on print resources
- 2005-2006 A campus-wide "strategic positioning" effort reported a lack of support for researchers in finding funding opportunities or grant writing.
- 2006 Libraries approached OVPR about the potential of a workshop to meet support needs.

History of Collaboration – Initial Meetings

- Assisting researchers in finding and using resources
 - Library Strengths searching and database navigation skills
 - OVPR Strengths most grant databases funded by OVPR

History of Collaboration – Initial Meetings

- Connecting users to tools
 - Library strengths infrastructure for conducting workshops and experienced instructors
 - OVPR strengths grant writing experience

History of Collaboration – Initial Meetings

- Helping identify potential collaborators on campus
 - Library strengths library liaison program
 - OVPR strengths strong link with Graduate School, regular communications with campus groups interested in grants and funding, highly regarded on campus


History of Collaboration





STARTING POINTS FOR YOUR FUNDING SEARCH**

- 1. Network with colleagues working in similar research areas who might have experience and knowledge with internal and external funding sources.
- 2. Use the Office of the Vice-President for Research (OVPR) "Collaborate" homepage as a gateway to opportunities: http://www.collaborate.umn.edu/explore/explore_index.html.
- 3. Research funded proposals to ensure the 'fundability' of your idea: http://www.collaborate.umn.edu/explore/developing.html:
 - **CRISP** (biomedical grants)
 - CRIS (agriculture, food and nutrition, forestry grants)
 - U. S. Department of Education
 - Environmental Protection Agency
 - Institute of Museum and Library Services
 - National Endowment for the Arts
 - National endowment for the Humanities
 - National Science Foundation
 - Foundation Directory Online (see "search grants")
- 4. Check out internal funding opportunities at the U: http://www.collaborate.umn.edu/explore/funding.html (intramural research and graduate student funding).
- 5. Before starting to search in external funding databases, consider how you would describe your search, in <u>broad</u> terms:
 - What is your area of interest?
 - How will the money be used?
 - Who are you?

Additional questions to address, once a basic search strategy is determined, include:

- Where will the research occur?
- When will the research take place (proposal and funding deadlines)?

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STARTING POINTS FOR YOUR FUNDING SEARCH**

6. Use of many of the external funding databases requires authentication and authorization. If you are working off-campus or on a computer not connected to the University network, you may not be recognized as a legitimate user.

In some cases (e.g., Foundation Directory Online), only your x500 user ID and password are required.

For other subscription databases (e.g., SPIN, IRIS, COS), you may need to download and install VPN (Virtual Personal Network) software. VPN software is available at the Academic Computing website, http://www1.umn.edu/adcs/help/vpn/.

- 7. Search in multiple databases (http://www.collaborate.umn.edu/explore/searching.html):
 - IRIS
 - SPIN
 - COS
 - Foundation Directory Online
 - Grants.gov

Where possible, use the advanced search (or main search) option. Utilize the keywords (the 'index') available in the database to capture the maximum number of funding possibilities. Pay attention to whether you are using OR (broadening connector) or AND (narrowing connector) when combining keywords.

- 8. Keep detailed records of your searches (database, keywords, other limiting descriptors, e.g., 'postdoctoral'). Developing a good search strategy is an iterative process.
- 9. Save satisfactory searches and set up personalized email alerts, including alerts from **Grants.gov** and **RFP Bulletin** (see http://www.collaborate.umn.edu/explore/searching.html). Over time, you may be able to eliminate a database as a resource because the alert results are not applicable.
