



"It's time to recognize the **Bay Area's Best Workplaces for Commuters** for providing commuter benefits that encourage employees to find alternative ways to commute to work, other than driving alone, thus helping to reduce the region's traffic congestion, improving air quality, and enhancing the quality of life for their employees."

To qualify as one of the **Bay Area's Best Workplaces for Commuters**SM, organizations must provide:





• At least three supporting commuter benefits, which can include carpool/vanpool incentives, lockers/showers for bikers or walkers, incentives for living near work, or onsite amenities such as day care or dry cleaning.























- A central point of contact for information, who actively informs employees of available commuter benefits.
- Access to a regional or employer-provided Emergency/Guaranteed Ride Home program.
