- Team of GPO librarians and FDLP specialists


































#### Regulations

- Staffing
- Public service
- Cooperative efforts —
  activities that libraries undertake to participate effectively
  with GPO and other depositories in the FDLP
- Specialized regulations applicable only to regional depository libraries and highest state appellate court libraries








#### Free, public access

Keep the following in mind regarding free, public access:

- Access involves making Federal depository resources in all formats available and usable for all library patrons regardless of library affiliation, disability, age, or other patron status.
- Any member of the general public may use depository resources in all formats at a Federal depository library free of charge and without impediments.
- Public access involves bibliographic, physical building, tangible collection, onsite computer, and Internet access.





### Comparability

Keep the following in mind regarding **comparability**:

 Depository services and assistance for the library's depository information resources must be of the same quality or comparable to that for other library collections and services.
