
2011 RESULT HIGHLIGHTS

THE PURPOSE OF THE BIENNIAL SURVEY IS TO REPORT ON THE CONDITIONS IN DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES.

REQUIRED BY LAW (44 USC §1909), THE BIENNIAL SURVEY GATHERS DATA FROM ALL OF THE DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES EVERY 2 YEARS.

- * SENT TO 1,201 DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES PARTICIPATING IN THE FEDERAL DEPOSITORY LIBRARY PROGRAM (FDLP) AS OF 9.2011.
- * SELECT RESULTS APPEAR IN THIS INFOGRAPHIC. A FULL RESULTS REPORT IS AVAILABLE FOR DOWNLOAD AT FDLP.GOV.
- * SUBMISSIONS RECEIVED FROM 1,181 DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES = 98% RESPONSE RATE FROM FDLP PARTICIPANTS.
- * ALL DEPOSITORIES WERE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT RESPONSES.




ARE YOU CONSIDERING CHANGING YOUR DESIGNATION FROM REGIONAL TO SELECTIVE?




