Are you looking for information from or about the Federal Government?

Would you like to be able to easily locate exactly which libraries in your area can provide access to that information?

What if there was a direct link to the information you need online?

- Utilize a simple keyword search.
- Access advanced and expert search options.
- Browse the full Catalog.
- View new titles from the past week to the past three months.
- Narrow your search by specific catalog:
 - Congressional Serial Set (House and Senate Reports, House and Senate Documents, Senate Executive Reports and Documents, and Senate Treaty Documents)
 - Congressional Publications (publications of the House of Representatives and the Senate)
 - Historic Shelflist (The U.S. Government Printing Office's historic card catalog covering U.S. Government documents from the 1870s to 1992)
 - Internet Publications (records for and links to Federal Government publications that are available online)
 - Serials (bibliographic records for continuing Government titles such as journals, annuals and periodicals)
- Set aside select records using the **bookshelf** feature.
- Email up to 20 search results or records for convenient information sharing.

GPO is the authoritative national source for descriptive and subject cataloging for Federal Government documents.

The U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO) and its skilled librarians are required, by law, to create descriptive records for U.S. Government publications. These records contain valuable information about each publication, such as title, author, publisher, and related subject keywords, to name just a few.
