### DISCUSSION

# Patrons are unlikely to ask us for help.

63% report never asking a librarian.

### Or search the library catalog.

76% report rarely or never searching the library catalog.

# (don't even ask about shelf browsing)

Only 16% report browsing shelves at least quarterly. And most of those are probably librarians.

# But they are using government information.

#### They search Google.

56% report searching on a weekly or monthly basis. Only 9% never search Google for government information.

## Or they go directly to the source.

57% reported browsing government websites directly on a quarterly (or more frequent) basis.

# And sometimes they use our guides and databases.

24% use guides at least quarterly. 35% use databases quarterly.

### Takeaway?

Patrons don't act the way they used to. And they definitely don't act like us.

## We're collecting the wrong statistics.

Catalogs, databases, and print are the minority. We're only seeing a fraction of actual use.
