BRUSSELS -- Global warming will parch large swaths of the Earth and threaten the existence of up to 30 percent of its animals and plants, a United Nations scientific panel warned in a report released today. About 1 billion people will be affected by water shortages because of declining snow cover on one-sixth of the world's land, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report says. The Bush administration said today the latest report by an international scientific panel examining the effects of climate change would lead to no shift in U.S. global-warming policies that shun mandatory curbs on emissions of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases. "This report reinforces" administration policies that emphasize technology development and the production of alternative fuels, President Bush's top environmental adviser, James Connaughton, told reporters in a telephone briefing after the report's release in Brussels. 



NOAA LEADS CLIMATE IMPACT AND ADAPTATION ACTIVITIES Agency Contributes to Scientific Foundation of IPCC

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change released its report on impacts, adaptation and vulnerability to climate change for the Fourth Assessment. Ongoing research conducted by NOAA contributed to a large part of the progress that has been made since the Third Assessment in 2001. Many NOAA-funded activities contributed data and research to the growing body of literature on impacts and adaptation assessed by the 2007 report. "NOAA's climate research and related work extends far beyond its contributions to IPCC, and adds direct benefit to the nation and to the world through various products that are used in commerce, government and the every-day lives of ordinary people," said retired Navy VADM Conrad Lautenbacher, Ph.D., undersecretary of commerce for oceans and atmosphere and NOAA administrator.



Officially named the Research Library of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, this site offers full-text searching of legislative histories back to 1997 (and with limited information back to 1993). Includes committee minutes and bill texts with easy-to-use searching capabilities.

Includes State Senate and Assembly information and session minutes, as well as links to the full texts of Nevada Statutes, Revised Statutes, and State Supreme Court Opinions.

The Center works with the U.S. Census Bureau to provide public access to census statistics and information. Uniform Crime Reports

The Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program was conceived in 1929 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police to meet a need for reliable, uniform crime statistics for the nation. In 1930, the FBI was tasked with collecting, publishing, and archiving those statistics. Today, several annual statistical publications, such as the comprehensive ***Crime in the United States***, are produced from data provided by nearly 17,000 law enforcement agencies across the United States.

Other annual publications, such as ***Hate Crime Statistics*** and ***Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted*** address specialized facets of crime such as hate crime or the murder and assaults of law enforcement officers respectively.

Special studies, reports, and monographs prepared using data mined from the UCR's large database are published each year as well. In addition to these reports, information about the ***National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS)***, ***UCR Frequently Asked Questions***, and ***UCR Incident Specific Questions*** are also available on this site.


Crime and Justice In Nevada 2005



Burglary




Burglary Rates Nevada, Western States, National

This site allows you to view crime data by choosing basic crime types in proximity to an address, intersection, school, or other geographic points and areas of interest for a period of one to 60 days. You can print summary reports and maps using this data."

The next paragraph states: "Any use of the information for commercial purposes is strictly prohibited. A request to link to this site must be made in writing to the Sheriff, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department. I understand that the information on this site is for informational purposes only. I understand that multiple incidents at a location and incidents that may not geocode will affect the number of incidents portrayed on the map and in tables and reports in the program. 

The US government is considering a massive plan to store almost all scientific data generated by federal agencies in publicly accessible digital repositories. The aim is for the kind of data access and sharing currently enjoyed by genome researchers via GenBank, or astronomers via the National Virtual Observatory, but for the whole of US science. Why Weed ?

- ▶ Mandates
- ▶ Shelf Space / Organic Collection
- ▶ Superseded Items

House Cleaning

Replacement of Volumes / Newer Editions

First things to consider

- ▶ Top down discussions (Director, Assoc Dir)
 - Get Support from the very top early on – you will need it
- ▶ Explain clearly what is being done
- ▶ Title 44 : read it, know it
- ▶ Faculty Concerns
 - Have a prepared response
- ▶ Your time – Teach, Desk hrs, other duties ?

Next Step

- ▶ Review the GPO Superseded list ; first to go –
- ▶ Let your Regional know what you are up to
- ▶ Share with your colleagues what is being done – weeding is not a crime – people have diverse ideas and thoughts
- ▶ Weeding should not be done in secrecy

Develop a weeding policy

Avoid emotional entanglements

Preparation

- ▶ Be open to the advice of colleagues – inside and outside your dept – talk to your subject specialists
- ▶ Shelf space – Do you have to enough to store items pulled from the collection ? Space to store material and space to process material
- ▶ Staff – time / energy withdrawing records
- ▶ Students – pulling items – time/other duties

More Preparation

- ▶ Money – boxes, tape..etc
- ▶ Space – where do we pack?
 - Do you have an area to process incoming materials and process outgoing materials?
- ▶ Overtime, if needed
- ▶ Who takes the boxes to the mail room – weight allowances
- ▶ Expect the unexpected - Always

It begins

- ▶ Our friends in need (Hawaii)
- ▶ Your neighbors (UVSC example)
- ▶ GPO (they are going home)
- ▶ The Regional
- ▶ CRL ?
 - Foreign Materials
- ▶ Special Collections at home – University of the Deseret example
Know your schools history – really look at material
Duplicate copies – UU Western Americana Collection
- ▶ Don't forget your law library (if you have one)
- ▶ Other list-serves (be pro-active)

Dealing with Multiple Asks

- ▶ Who are your friends from the past?
- ▶ Postage: to charge or not to charge ?
- ▶ Invoicing – is it worth it?
- ▶ Know the rules of your budget officer

Disposal

- ▶ If you have to
- ▶ Mark as needed
- ▶ Watch out for the dumpster diver
 - Have a response ready
