- Provide access to information in appropriate formats
- Ensure continuing access to digitally available government information
- Provide excellent training to deepen and expand knowledge of government information resources via excellent training



- Provide high quality descriptive tools for access to all FDLP publication, portals, and information products.
- Enhance collaboration or coordination of effort among federal depository libraries, non-depository libraries, GPO, agencies, and cultural memory organizations that deal with internet resources.



 Expand awareness of both the Federal Depository Library Program and government information generally via excellent public relations and marketing.
