

Promoting the FDLP through Public Library Services for Immigrants

ABSTRACT

This presentation is an overview of Memphis Public Libraries' effort in promoting FDLP resources through partnership with United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, and engagement with multicultural community groups and organizations. It will disclose how these resources and partnerships have allowed Memphis Public Libraries to provide services and programs such as Naturalization Ceremonies, Citizenship Corners, and International Story Times etc., as a means of keeping immigrants informed and helping them realize their "American Dreams."

Benjamin L. Hooks Central Library



In 2017, Memphis Public Libraries established 6 Citizenship Corners with the help of USCIS (United States Citizenship and Immigration Services) supplying public libraries with free materials and resources related to citizenship and immigration. In addition, Memphis Library Foundation supported libraries with \$10,000 in funding for enhancing ESL and foreign language collections related to establishing Citizenship Corners at Central, Cossitt, Cordova, Parkway Village, and Randolph branch libraries.

In addition to Citizenship Corners, MPL, in partnership with USCIS of the Department of Homeland Security and DAR (Daughters of American Revolution), have held over 27 moving and inspirational Naturalization Ceremonies at Benjamin Hooks Central Library since 2011. These special large scale naturalization ceremonies are held bi–annually in January during Martin Luther King Jr. birthday weekend (2 ceremonies), and in July the weekend of the Independence Day (2 ceremonies). Recently, we have also included information fairs to promote our library's civic services, resources and information along with local immigrant and civic organizations such as Latino Memphis and Shelby County Election Commission.

• Since 2011, held over 27 ceremonies (as of Sept, 2018)

- Over 4,300 candidates from over 100 countries being naturalized
- Over 8,700 families and friends witnessed & attended ceremonies


Legal Resources: Links to Internet resources, databases, and reference books that provide legal information and help with legal research are found here.






