The official record of the proceedings and debates of the U.S. Congress searchable from 1899.

#### **Committee Materials**

Full text and metadata for committee reports, including executive reports, searchable from 1995 (104th Congress). Also includes committee prints from 1993 (103rd Congress).

#### Glossary

Brief explanations of legislative terms.

#### Legislation

Information about every bill and resolution introduced in the U.S. Congress since 1973 and every amendment introduced or submitted since 1981. Congress.gov now also provides the full text of laws dating back to 1951, and 30,000 bills and resolutions from 1799-1873 were recently added to the site.

#### Members of Congress

Search for the members of Congress that represent you by address and explore member profile pages for the House which feature district maps.

#### Nominations

Nomination records 1981 (97th Congress) to the present.

#### **Treaty Documents**

All treaties submitted to the Senate since 1975 (94th Congress).
