
"RURAL": U.S. DEPT. OF AGRICULTURE

- Counties are the "standard building block for collecting economic data and for conducting research to track and explain regional population and economic trends"
- Counties are classified as either "metro" or "nonmetro"

"RURAL": U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

- "Nonmetro counties include some combination of:
- 1. open countryside,
- 2. rural towns (places with fewer than 2,500 people), and
- 3. urban areas with populations ranging from 2,500 to 49,999 that are not part of larger labor market areas (metropolitan areas)."



"RURAL": TOPICS AND STATES

Texas

Texas covers 261,797 square miles, with a 2017 estimated population of 28,304,596 people – 3,061,090 living in rural Texas (USDA-ERS). It ranks second among U.S. states in both area and population. Austin, the capital, is located in the south-central region of the state. The state's largest cities are Houston, San Antonio, and Dallas. According to 2017 data from the U.S. Census Bureau, 79.2% of the state's population is white, 12.7% is African-American, 5.0% is Asian, 1.0% is American Indian or Alaska Native, 0.1% is Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and 39.4% is of Hispanic or Latino origin.


Texas Rural Healthcare Facilities

There are 403 hospitals in Texas (Kaiser, 2016). The state has 85 hospitals identified as Critical Access Hospitals (Flex Team, 7/2018). There are 305 Rural Health Clinics in Texas (CMS, 2017), and 73 Federally Qualified Health Centers provide services at 499 sites in the state (NACHC, 2017).

Community Economic Development (CED) is a division within USDA Rural Development created to enhance the delivery of USDA Rural Development programs and services to people living in persistent poverty and in rural areas that have limited access to economic resources and job opportunities.

To take on these challenges, USDA Rural Development offers grants, low-interest loans, loan guarantees and technical assistance (professional training) to any rural business, member-Cooperative or economic development organization looking to improve the quality of life for their people.

We connect citizens with essential services such as affordable housing, business development, electricity and communication infrastructure (including broadband), health care, emergency services and equipment, clean water and healthy food.

RURAL HOUSING SERVICE

USDA's Rural Housing Service offers a variety of programs to build or improve housing and essential community facilities in rural areas. We offer loans, grants and loan guarantees for single- and multi-family housing, child care centers, fire and police stations, hospitals, libraries, nursing homes, schools, first responder vehicles and equipment, housing for farm laborers and much more.

We also provide technical assistance loans and grants in partnership with non-profit organizations, Indian tribes, state and federal government agencies, and local communities.



Submit a Loan Inquiry

Certified as a Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) by the U.S. Treasury Department, the Housing Assistance Council has offered low-cost rural housing development loans for over 40 years.

HAC makes short-term loans at below market interest rates to local nonprofits, for profits and government entities developing affordable housing for low-income, rural residents. HAC's loans enable borrowers to acquire land, pay architectural and environmental fees and cover other costs that arise before construction loans are available. HAC balances careful underwriting and meaningful collateral with flexibility and an understanding that a rural community's best

HAC's Training and Technical Assistance assist rural organizations to improve housing conditions for the rural poor, with an emphasis on the poorest of the poor in the most rural places. The division focuses on developing the capacity of local leaders in nonprofit organizations to help their own communities. This is done by providing formal trainings, one-on-one technical assistance and connecting local organizations to resources which can build their capacity and strengthen their community.


Policy


