James Jacobs -> All Participants: I will sometimes request that a url be added to the FDLP archive-it collection when I submit an unreported docs form (eg an index page with lots of documents listed). While the GPO catalogers usually get back to me pretty quickly that the unreported doc has been cataloged, they've never said anything about the seed recommendation. So I'm unsure how to request that a url get into FDLP archive-it.

Scott Matheson -> All Participants: Maybe a separate/sub form for the seed reccomendations so we get a separate confirmation...?

James Jacobs -> All Participants: or a radio button to mark the link for seed recommendation

jim jacobs -> All Participants: please consider these two criteria, either for "principles" or for proposed, needed "functionality" of a chosen PID service: 1. chosen a PID should be able to point to more than one location (more than one copy). 2) chosen PID should be able to point to or contain descriptive

informatino about the digital object to which it points.

James Jacobs -> All Participants: +1 Jim

Scott Matheson -> All Participants: PID can map to a "work" (in the FRBR sense) with additional/sub PIDs for intances ("edition").

James Jacobs -> All Participants: DOI already does that. eg a journal article might be on several servers, and the user is routed to the one nearest them

James Jacobs -> All Participants: load management

James Jacobs -> All Participants: exactly Will

jim jacobs -> All Participants: existing PID technologies are not limited to pointing to monographs or serial titles only. existing PIDs already point to complex digital objects and "small-grain" pieces (such as a table within an article within a journal).

James Jacobs -> All Participants: Jim, I'll be sure to bring that suggestion to the group when we next meet

James Jacobs -> All Participants: indeed. and wouldn't it be cool if "authenticated" copies could include content hosted at an FDLP library!

James Jacobs -> All Participants: some but not all documents

Scott Matheson -> All Participants: @james - sure thay can, check the signature back to GPO

James Jacobs -> All Participants: exactly!
