

Drive Thru Data: Using NLM APIs to Access Information Fast

What is an API?

An API is a set of protocols for contacting a remote system and making requests.

APIs typically include:

- A remote computer (or “server”) which has information for you to access, and
- A set of rules for making requests (or “calls”) to that server.

Building an API URL: MedlinePlus example

The Base URL (do not click; instead, copy and paste into your browser address bar)

Parameters (add this into your browser address bar after the Base URL)

?db=healthTopics&term=acid+reflux&retmax=5

Putting it all together
