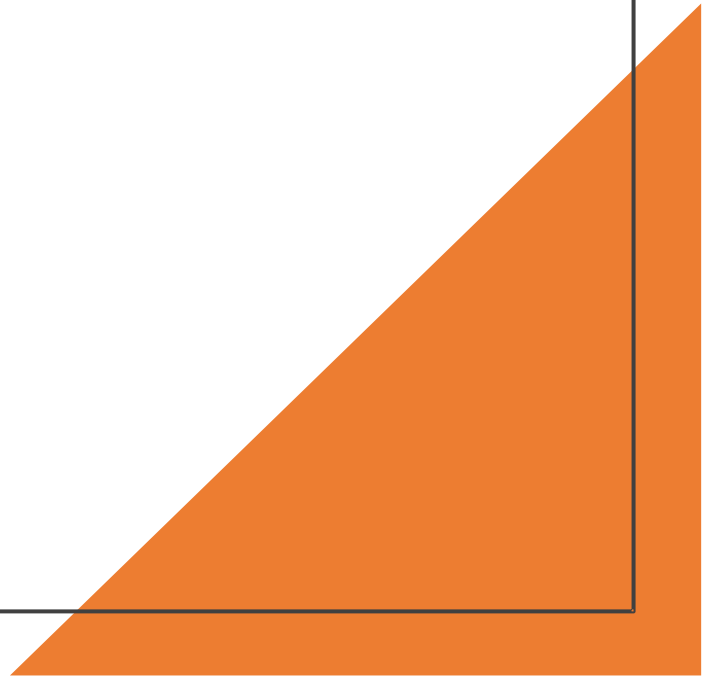

Indiana State Library

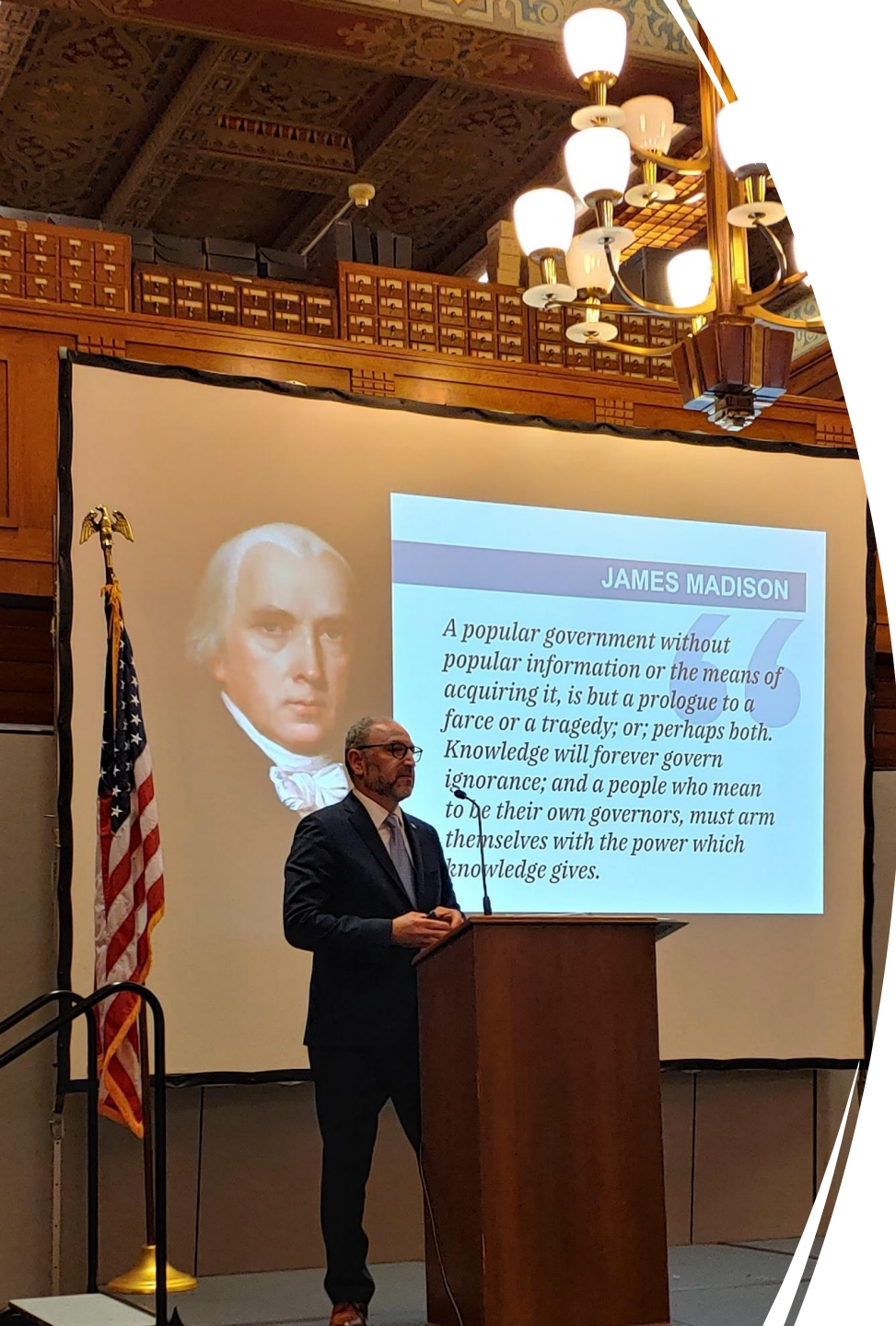
- Regional Depository for Indiana
- Community Scope
 - 92 Counties
- 2022 Federal Depository Library of the Year
- 3 Divisions of Service
 - Public
 - Statewide
 - Historical Bureau



Reaching 92 Counties: Macro Approach

- Train the Trainer
 - Identify Educators
 - Teachers, Librarians, Parents, etc.
 - Identify Message
 - What's the training
 - Determine Method
 - Conference, Webinar, Libguide, etc.





Examples at ISL

- Conference (Government Information Day)
 - Big approach, highest level of interaction w/ audience
- Webinars (Presenting or Hosting)
 - Medium approach, smaller scope but live interaction; added benefit if presentation is archived
- Blogs/Posts/Guides
 - No live interaction, slower way to get message out, but easiest to create/manage
 - Gov Docs Webpage on ISL website
 - Indiana Federal Documents (Wordpress site)
 - Government Information Minute section within ISL newsletter

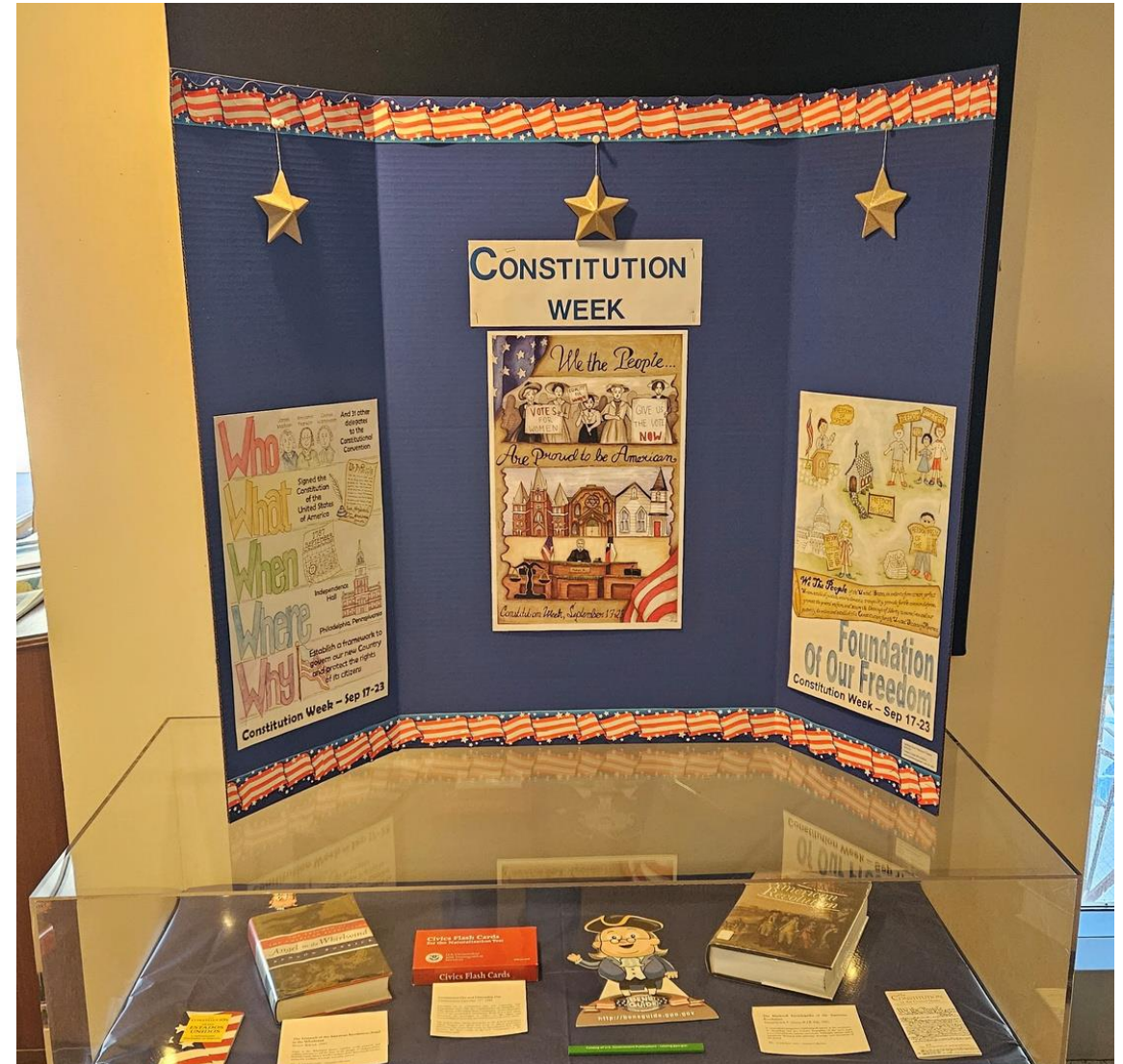
Creating Partnerships:

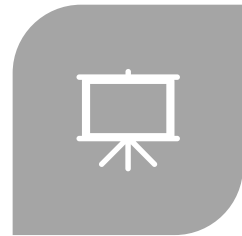

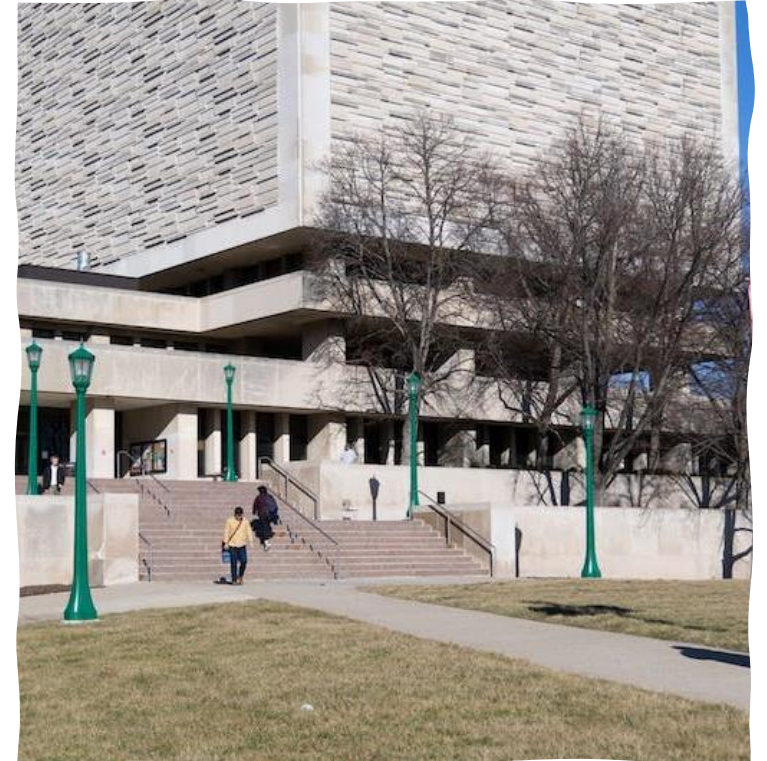
