Why should I continue to be a regional?

- Regional collections are still the core of the National Collection
- Needed expertise of regionals
- Build upon previous investment into their government publications programs/collections at their institution—for example, over half of regionals are in partnerships with GPO
- Provide a strong voice to the NCSA and broader community



What current roles continue to exist?

- Historical collections and preservation of them
- Collection management guidance
- Government information expertise
- Resource for selectives in their state/region for questions about the FDLP, overall best practices, program changes, etc.
- ILL
- Training
- Outreach to selectives and the general public communities served



What new roles can be created?

- Coordinate depository collections in regional and NCSA
- Serve on steering committees
- Promote discovery of and access to collections across the NCSAs
- Curate, coordinate, and preserve historic collection strengths in each NCSA
- Monitoring status of digitization projects
- Lead evaluation of tangible format equivalent needs

National Collection Service Areas

NCSAs group Federal depository libraries into four service areas as a means of:

- Ensuring geographically dispersed permanent public access to Federal Government information products;
- Sharing resources among depository libraries;
- Receiving services from GPO's Library Services and Content Management (LSCM); and
- Collaborating between and among depository libraries.



NCSA Steering Committees

Each NCSA will have a steering committee for the purposes of:

- Facilitating discussion and collaboration among the Federal depository libraries in the NCSA.
- Increasing opportunities for collection flexibilities and management.
- Increasing the collaborative possibilities for depository library administration and services (e.g., training, resource sharing).
- Developing planning documents (e.g., Collection Management Plan for the NCSA);
- Collaborating with GPO to develop and refine guidance and procedures to guide the FDLP in its digital transition.
