Cataloging and Indexing (C&I) Program

Mandated by Title 44 of the United States Code

Prepare and publish a comprehensive index of every Federal document issued or published by a department, bureau, or office, not confidential in nature, and regardless of format

Monthly Catalog: a print catalog (1895-2004)

Catalog of U.S. Government Publications (CGP): an online catalog; search tool for print and electronic titles of the National Bibliography of U.S. Government Publications

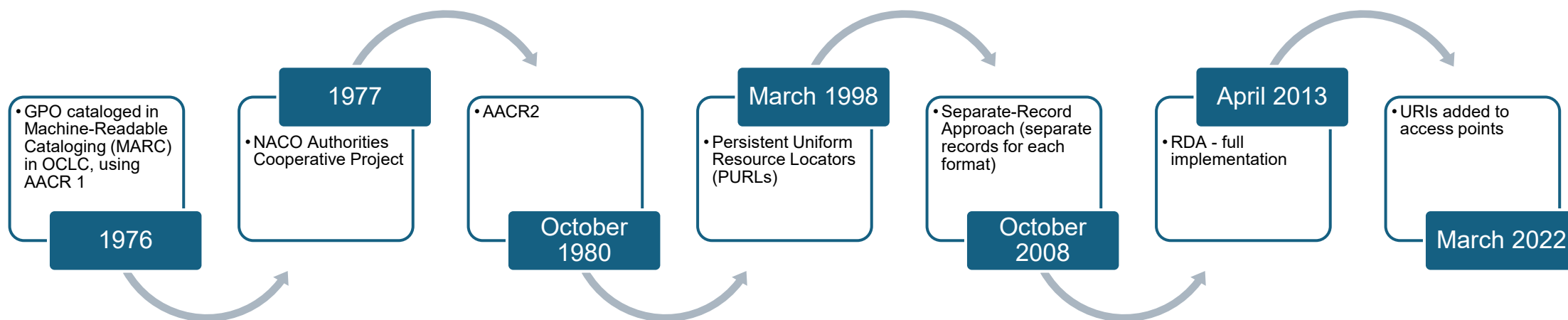

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Metadata Initiatives and AI test



AI Test: Goals

- Test the use of Microsoft Copilot to generate summaries of congressional committee hearings as a supplementary resource for the cataloging/metadata process
- Facilitate the assignment of Library of Congress Subject Headings in CGP and OCLC records by staff members
- Focus the use of AI tools on the materials that GPO catalogs and the specific characteristics of those materials
- Begin to establish general policies and procedures for testing the use of AI tools in MCS metadata operations and workflows



AI Test: Why Hearings?

- As mainly transcripts of what happens at hearings, the publications consist of statements, questions, answers, and submitted materials.
- Generally, do not have tables of contents, summaries, or other sections that describe the topics covered during the hearings.
- Exceptions, such as the House Committee on Natural Resources and Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
- Many hearings are long, and some consist of multiple volumes.
- Include materials submitted for the record, such as articles, reports, and witness statements that increase the complexity of the subject cataloging procedures.
- Ascertaining the main subject matter requires considerable effort.



AI Test: Procedures

- Three staff members catalog newly published hearings according to our standard policies and procedures.
- Include House and Senate hearings held by as many different committees as possible.
- Use Copilot to generate summaries of the hearings.
- Please note: We are not including the summaries in the records.
- Review the summaries and compare them with the subjects in the cataloged records.
- Record information for each publication, such as prompts used, usefulness ratings, observations, and recommendations.



AI Test: Preliminary Results

- Sample set is small (26): 8 House and 18 Senate hearings
- Usefulness ratings are: 5 (highest) to 1 (lowest)
- 60% of the summaries rated 5 or 4

AI Test: Preliminary Results

- In general, the summaries were relevant to the major points of the hearings as reflected in the assigned subject headings.
- Seen considerable variations in the formatting of the summaries and lists of main topics.
- Experienced a learning curve in the wording of prompts to get useful results.
- Need to refine prompts several times.



AI Test: Next Steps

- After compiling an adequate sample set, we will discuss the results of the test and evaluate the effectiveness of Copilot for generating the summaries.
- We will consider other approaches to the use of Copilot for this and other purposes.
- We will submit our recommendations on the use of Copilot for this workflow and for other types of publications, such as public laws, to LSCM management.



Data.gov: Goals

- Explore ways to increase awareness and usage of our metadata resources.
- Our sincere appreciation to the General Services Administration staff for their great collaboration.
- Data.gov was launched in 2009 and is managed and hosted by the General Services Administration.
- Under the OPEN Government Data Act, Government data is required to be made available in open, machine-readable formats, while continuing to ensure privacy and security.
- Federal agencies are not required to submit their data, and other Government agencies can contribute their resources to the Data Catalog.

Data.gov: Process Overview

- Data.gov harvests metadata about resources that will be discoverable in the Data.gov Data Catalog.
- Contributors create a JSON (JavaScript Object Notation) or XML file of metadata describing the resources to be included in the Data Catalog and makes the file available to the Data.gov harvester.
- The Data Catalog entries provide the links to the resources posted by the contributors on their websites.

Historic Monthly Catalog Project

- In 2024 ProQuest/Clarivate announced the retirement of their Monthly Catalog of the United States Government (MoCat) Database.
- Superintendent of Documents Scott Matheson established an agreement with ProQuest that allowed GPO to acquire a copy of their data under the [Creative Commons CC-BY-NC 4.0 DEED license](#) and make the content publicly available.
- GPO's metadata experts analyzed the entire dataset and extracted over 1.2 million MARC records that will be made available in the *Historic Monthly Catalog*.



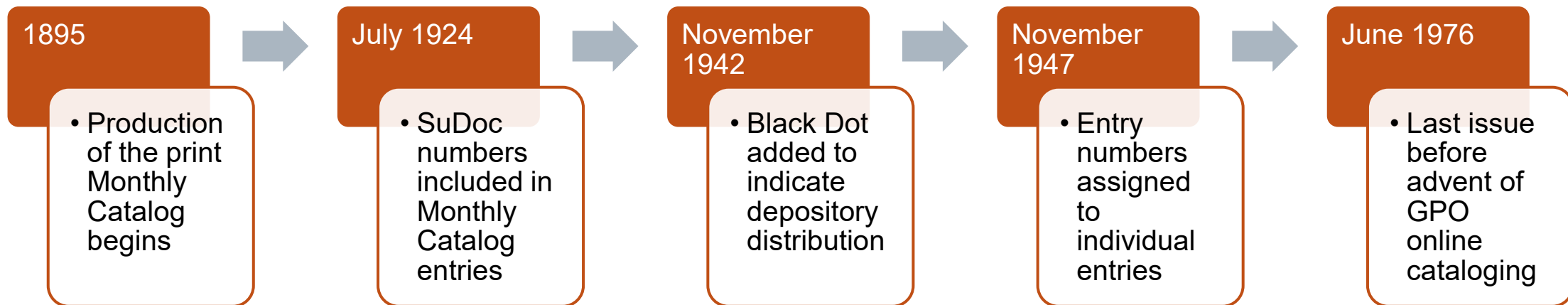
Historic Monthly Catalog Project

- The goal is to make the MARC records accessible in a form that represents the entries in the original print *Monthly Catalog*. No attempt has been made to bring these records up to GPO's current cataloging standards.
- This will be a static database, and GPO will not be making corrections to these records after the *Historic Monthly Catalog* is released.



Key Data Milestones, 1895-1976

GPO's cataloging practices evolved over the years, resulting in changes to the print *Monthly Catalog* and how entries were presented. These changes impact the data that is available in the *Historic Monthly Catalog* records.





Goals and Challenges

- Convert the ProQuest MODS metadata into MARC records.
- Retain the character of the original data in the *Monthly Catalog*.
- Transform metadata designed for an online database into records for an online catalog.
- Manage metadata created under various policies and procedures over a span of 81 years.



Analysis and Evaluation

- Reviewed the information about the MODS metadata provided by ProQuest
- Examined a set of sample records to assess structure and organization of the MODS
- Developed our overall plan and discussed each MODS field
- Built a database of the MODS metadata
- Collected metrics on each element to assess their prevalence and importance in the dataset
- Decided not to apply current metadata standards to records or to attempt to collocate serial issues

MODS to MARC Mapping

- Created a MODS to MARC mapping document
- Confirmed the fields to be included in the records
- Generated a set of preliminary test records for expert staff members to check
- Reviewed their comments and recommendations
- Discussed several general issues, such as encoding level and cataloging description conventions
- Finalized the initial metadata specifications for the conversion process



Testing and Record Reviews

- Randomly extracted records by each year of the *Monthly Catalog* into sample sets for the project team to review
- Recorded our observations and modified the specifications and the conversion process according to the team's recommendations
- Iterated the testing procedures several times
- Reached a consensus that the records were ready for the ingest process

Next Steps

- Compare the 1.2 million *Monthly Catalog* records with the CGP
- Identify records that are not in the CGP
- Develop a plan and process for adding those records to the CGP
- Mine the records as a dataset for various purposes, such as reporting metrics about the publications in the *Monthly Catalog* on FDLP.gov and planning for National Collection digitization efforts

Historic Monthly Catalog 1895-1976 Catalog to Search

In accordance with the Public Printing and Binding Act of 1895, the Superintendent of Documents began producing a *Monthly Catalogue* in January 1895, continuing under various titles until December 2004. In July 1976, GPO began cataloging electronically, a change that also enabled the Catalog of U.S. Government Publications and some commercial bibliographic databases to include the GPO cataloging records back to July 1976. However, the print *Monthly Catalog* remained the primary access point to pre-1976 government publications for many years.

To fill that gap GPO established an agreement with ProQuest that allowed GPO to acquire a copy of their data under the [Creative Commons CC-BY-NC 4.0 DEED license](#) and make the content publicly available. The content covered GPO's cataloging output from 1895 through June 1976 as printed in the *Monthly Catalog* during that time. This *Historic Monthly Catalog* data set provides access to MARC records extracted from that data set.

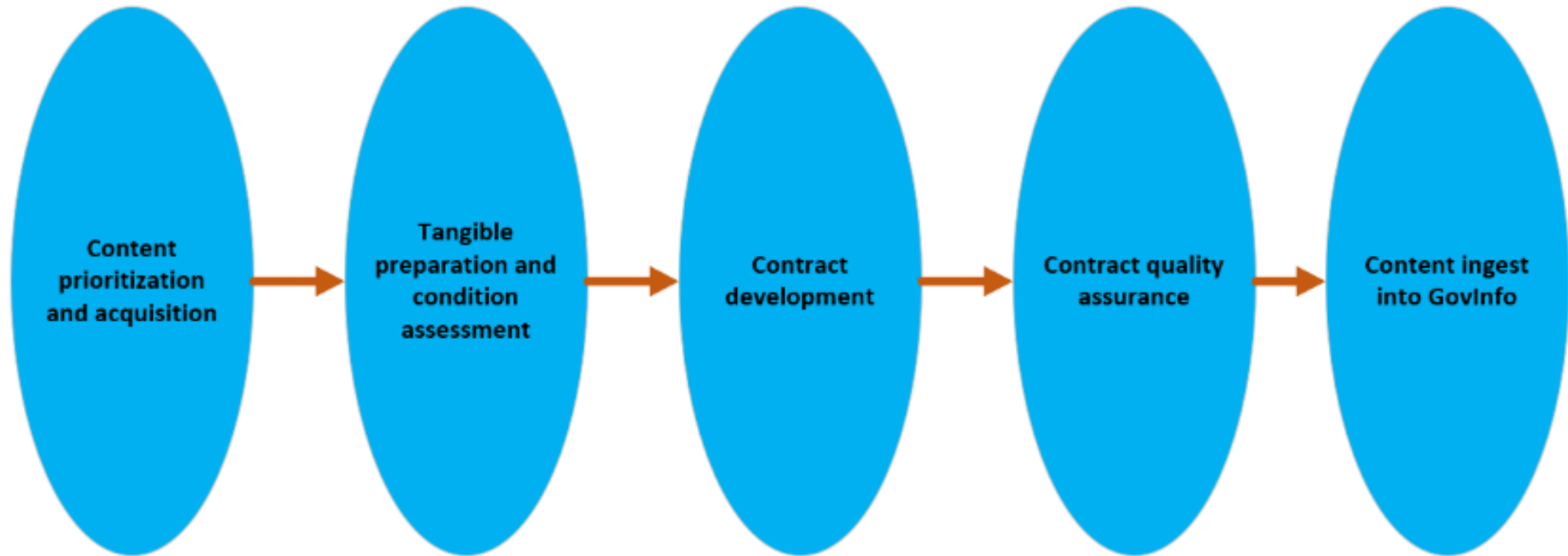


Digital Imaging Specifications

- Follow the Federal Agencies Digital Guidelines Initiative's [“Technical Guidelines for Digitizing Cultural Heritage Materials”](#) three-star level.
- Additional specifications include (exact specifications may differ based on the content being digitally imaged):
 - 400 ppi (original document size) with 24-bit RGB color.
 - Master file format: JPEG 2000 with up to a 20:1 lossless compression ratio.
 - Searchable and optimized PDFs compliant to the PDF/A2-b format specification standard.
 - OCR text saved as .txt file format for each publication.
 - Pages should have no visible skew (no more than between 0-1 degrees)
 - Pages cropped so the page edge is showing with a border of no less than 1/16 inch and no larger than ¼ inch.

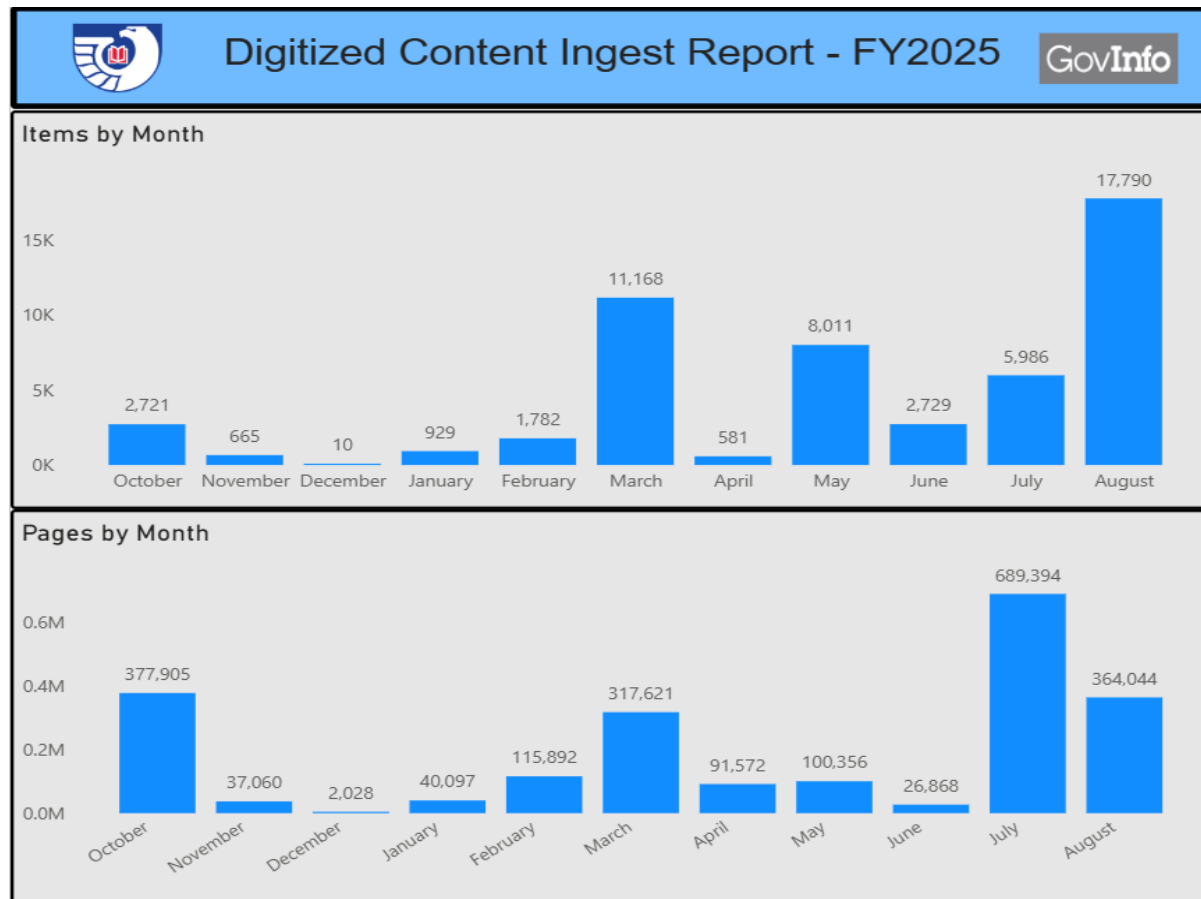

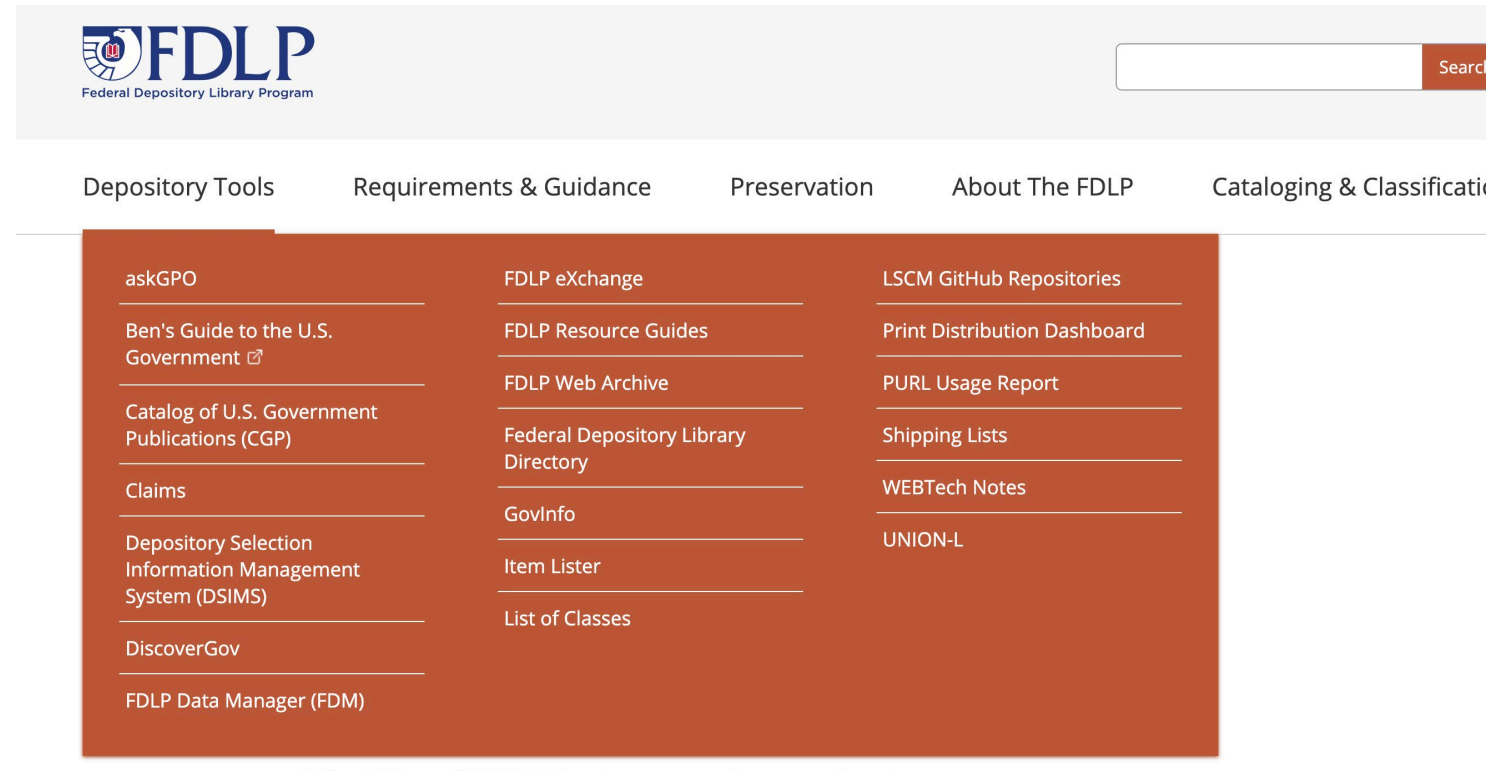

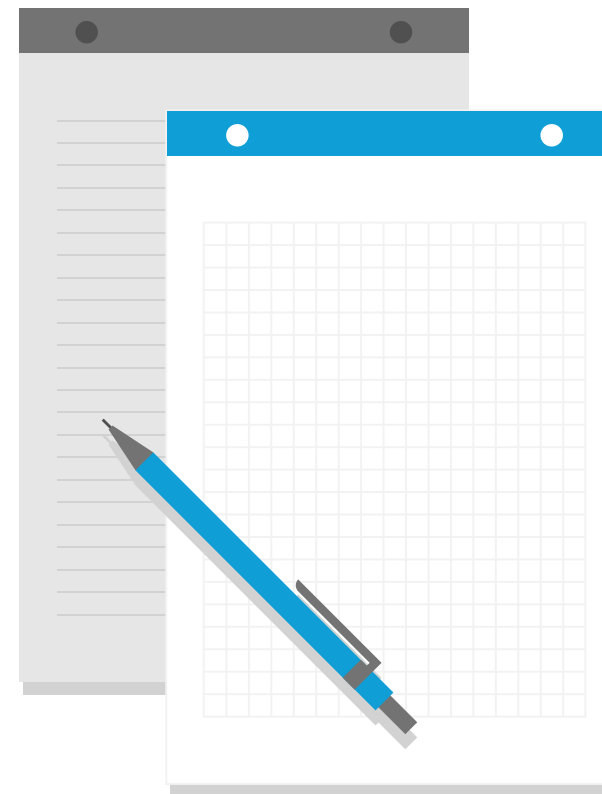

Community Needs Assessment

- All depository coordinators should be able to access and use all public-facing GPO tools that meet their specific needs.
- All coordinators should understand the structure of the FDLP, including selective and regional depositories, and the National Collection Service Areas (NCSAs).
- New coordinators should be provided with the training they need to perform effectively in their role.
- Someone on the FDLP depository library staff should be able to provide Federal government information reference assistance to users.





Community Needs Assessment

Purpose: To develop, expand, or continue services aimed at allowing all federal depository libraries meet stated goals using available resources.

- **Objective 1**: Discover specific problems and issues faced by the community
- **Objective 2**: Determine which services are valued and used by the community, and where gaps currently exist
- **Objective 3**: Determine gaps in training and education.
