

### What's a Government Document?

The term "government document" is a broad term that is used to categorize information disseminated by a government branch or agency. Materials produced at the local, state, federal, and international levels, and materials produced by government-funded agencies and organizations, are all considered government documents.

The federal government documents that we have at Jefferson College were either produced for one of the branches of government or on behalf of a government department or agency, like the Department of Defense, the Smithsonian, or the National Park Service.

Government documents and information products are available in a variety of formats, including paper, film, microfilm, CDs, and digital files available online. Throughout this exhibition you will find government documents in braille, photographs, a publication on CD, a paper wheel from the Census showing state data, maps, books, pamphlets, flashcards, and more.





### Important Landmarks in Women's Rights Legislation 1

The Nineteenth Amendment - Approved n 1919, this Constitutional Amendment prohibited states from depriving a citizen the right to vote on the basis of sex.

The Equal Pay Act of 1963 - In a time when women were primarily viewed as nomemakers, this series of labor laws helped pave the way for women to more securely enter the American workforce by promising equitable wages for the same work regardless of race, religion, sex, or nationality.

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 - This civil rights law prohibits sexbased discrimination in any school or academic setting. It is still a topic of vigorous discussion, especially in regards to school sports

Roe v. Wade - Perhaps one of the most divisive Supreme Court cases of recent years, Roe v. Wade legalized abortion in the U.S. for nearly 50 years. It was overturned on June 24, 2022.
























# **Suggestions**

- When we create a display, we want it to be more than just a table of "dead" materials. The key is to
  carefully choose topics and items that spark curiosity. A good display mixes the serious with the fun—
  government publications alongside creative elements and decorations—so it's both educational and
  engaging.
- We can use displays to announce upcoming events or training sessions, share our social media accounts, invite people to connect, and provide QR codes and URLs that link directly to LibGuides.
   Adding contact information encourages people to reach out for further assistance.
- If you have student staff, involve them—their creativity and perspective bring energy and help the display connect with other students. It's also important to tie displays into the bigger picture, collaborating with other library or campus events to reach more people.
- Promotion matters too: work with the library's social media team, campus news outlets, or listservs to spread the word. This multiplies your reach and impact.
- By combining creativity, collaboration, continuity, smart planning, and promotion, displays become
  more than decorations—they create a vibrant, ongoing learning environment that changes how
  people see and use government information.





# Finding and Accessing Missing or Redacted Government Information

It can feel disheartening to read yet another story regarding the seemingly endless stream of federal government agency and government information purges occurring during the current presidential transition phase. However, all is not lost thanks to teams of researchers, academics, and librarians working to archive government information before it disappears.

At CSU Stanislaus, librarians have been working to archive government websites using the Internet Archive's Wayback Machine. In addition, the University Library maintains a robust Government Resources Guide and we are working to monitor the guide and replace missing government resources with archived resources so that access to vital government information can be maintained. 

### What is Government Information?

U.S. Code (44 U.S.C. 1901) defines a government document as "...informational matter which is published as an individual document at government expense or as required by law." Every governmental division produces documents, images, or artifacts that belong to the citizens of the United States and can be accessed through a variety of means online, by written request, through the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), or by walking into many institutions and using their libraries or other resource station. [Read more]

### What is civic engagement?

Civic engagement means working to make a difference in the civic life of our communities and developing the combination of knowledge, skills, values and motivation to make that difference. It means promoting the quality of life in a community, through both political and non-political processes. – Ehrlich, T. (2000). Civic responsibility and higher education, Phoenix, AZ: Orvx.

Civic engagement is "the active participation of individuals in their communities, aiming to improve social, political, and cultural life. It encompasses a wide range of activities, both political and non-political, that contribute to the well-being of the community," - Al.

Publisher Rice University This project piloted a process for creating a repository of interesting, realworld government datasets that are easy to access, beginner-friendly, and suitable for educational use, particularly in data science. The project resulted in three sub-projects, each of which uses one or more open government datasets to demonstrate the data science pipeline. The first subproject (1 mental health project) used the U.S. Census Bureau's Household Pulse survey to explore correlates of mental health during the COVID-19 pandemic. The second sub-project

(2 education demographics project) used the National Center for Education Statistics' National Household Education Survey and Common Core of Data along with the Texas Education Agency's graduation data to explore relationships among educational outcomes, student and family demographic variables, and county demographic diversity within the 12th grader population. The third sub-project

(3\_economics\_employment\_project) used the U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey and a wide range of financial data (COVID-related spending, Medicaid spending, GDP, and minimum wage) to explore the relationship beteen government fiscal relief measures and employment during recessions. The three sub-project folders include clean datasets, code for cleaning and analyzing the data, and interpretation of the results. These materials are suitable for a range of learners within data science, including both novices and those with advanced statistical skills






## **Key Takeaway**



- Develop a strategic plan with clear goals to guide your promotion efforts. All of this work should be rooted in the FDLP mission and vision, and it much aligns with university and/or library's strategic goals.
- Success doesn't come from big, one-time efforts, but from building consistency. Start small and simple. Remember weekly or regular efforts can be very influential.
- Series and packages build habits, patterns, and a strong brand—avoiding random, orphan activities.
- Along the way, partnerships are essential.
- Balance quality and quantity.
- Focus on outreach, engagement, and communication.
- With passion, the right attitude, growing expertise, technology and management skills, as well as strong collaboration, these promotion efforts can become not just another task—but a sustainable, enjoyable process that strengthens our library govdocs programs and services.
