It has not been a pretty process. We just want one 856 field to show up as a portfolio in our public facing Primo NDE, so it won't be overwhelming for our end users: college students.

Jill Strykowski:
Is there a technical systems overview somewhere - the discovery points you all manage are 1) GovInfo, 2) Discovery.gov 3) CGP... GovInfo is on a custom-developed DAM, correct? Discovery.com is migrating from what? to Alma? And CGP is on what platform?

Are you all cataloging in Marva Bibframe at all since LoC made that change?

Appologies - link to ADA.gov fact sheet <https://www.ada.gov/resources/2024-03-08-web-rule/> - compliance was to be summer 2026 and many academic libraries and ACRL raised major concerns since almost all Libguide pages are inaccessible - DOJ pushed the deadline to summer 2027 - standard is WCAG 2.1 Level AA

@cw we are talking about adding it to existing records. The info I have states non generic works like not using click here. Also looking at adding to Marc Edit tasks. One issue is that the links got directly to pdfs, to choose version to download, to web sites, to html files. So will need to be a generic statement
